

German Light Tank "Praga"

This is the 1/76th scale Fujimi kit. Fujimi has absorbed the Nitto line in this scale, and continues to be the only manufacturer in this HO scale.

The Czech Praga here represents an AFV of the 7th Panzer Division under the command of General Rommel. The 38(t) accounted for one-fourth of the panzers deployed in France.

This 9.7 ton tank, operated by a crew of four, mounted a 37mm cannon and two machine-guns. It was powered by a 1X Praga 7.75 litre OHV six Cyl. Inline water cooled petrol engine developing 125 hp at 2200 rpm.

No. 613 was photographed crossing a bridge over the Somme River on 5 June 1940.

Note: Photographic documentation confirms the Wehrmacht frequently used the NAZI flag to identify AFV's.









Gator's Grip Acrylic Hobby Glue

Maybe I shouldn't admit it... but I really, really, really hate super-glue. It seems to take forever to set, leaving me trying to figure out how to hold two parts together while applying accelerator with my third hand. However; it always sets instantly when you don't want it to set, sticking parts together before you get a chance to place them correctly or else sticking the parts to the workbench or your fingers.

Gator's Grip is new product from a fellow down in Louisiana. It's an acrylic or water-based product that looks and has a thickness very much like a white glue such as Elmer's. Gator's Grip on the other hand will like super-glue

stick about anything including metal together and is similar in bonding strength to super-glue. Like white glue it has a surface tension that holds parts in place until the glue dries. So you can apply a small amount with a tooth-pick to your model and then apply a photo-etched part. The glue will hold it in position until it dries. Since it doesn't dry instantly you have time to adjust the part until you get it where you want it. Being water-based too much Gator's Grip can be removed with a moist paint brush while it's still wet. And it's non-toxic and has no discernable smell. When dry it becomes a translucent clear much like white glue. I haven't tried it on clear parts but it seems that it would work fine. It takes and holds paint well, and once painted will be as invisible as any other form of glue.

When dried Gator's Grip has a somewhat rubbery texture. It has enough 'give' that if a free standing photo-etched part (such as radio antennae on an aircraft or the railing on a ship model) applied with it is bumped the glue flexes instead of instantly snapping off like with super-glue. Such parts can actually be wiggled back and forth without breaking them off. On the other hand since it is rubbery it cannot be used to fill and sand like super-glue. Instead of leaving a clean sharp edge sanding it causes it to break off in chunks leaving an uneven rough surface.

So all in all like any other product it has it's advantages and disadvantages. There's a few purposes that I'm going to keep the super-glue around for. But it's nice to have another option. Gator's Grip is available from: <http://www.gatorsmask.com/index.html>.


