#### That 24 Hour Thing Again: Rocky Sink

Well, the last weekend in January not only brought a month down in the new year but also the Annual 24 Hour Build on Facebook again. Like in the past the build is the last weekend in January to coincide with the Rolex 24 Hour race in Daytona. This year the build was just like in the past, with the only exception of adding Zoom meeting to the fun. Since Zoom had become a big part of everyone's life this past year the guys that take care of over seeing the build decided to let everyone be invited to a Zoom 24-hour meeting and be able to show what you were doing as well as posting pictures like in the past on Facebook.

This year I decided to build a 1969 Ford Shelby Mustang Convertible. It seemed like it would be a fairly straight forward build with little "roadblocks" in the way. Of course, there are always those things that pop up you don't think will, especially in a quick build. With the start and end time being the same this year (noon Saturday till noon Sunday) I did my usual annual trip to Cracker Barrel early Saturday morning to get fueled up for a long day and night. A good hearty big breakfast will go a long way on something like this.

Having already had everything laid out and all the paint and supplies needed for the build it was just a matter of waiting for the start time. When noon hit, I started on the body prep and assembly of parts that would need to be sanded after gluing, like the seats, engine/transmission, etc. After body prep it was time to move forward to priming the body and painting of bigger parts like chassis, engine, some interior pieces, etc. While these parts were trying in the dry booth, I started painting of smaller detail pieces like smaller engine pieces, wheels, interior items, and lights that needed painting. After a couple hours of dry time in the dry booth I gave the body three coats of Tamiya orange and back in the dry booth it went. I also was able to start assembly of the engine and chassis at this point as well as some of the finer detail painting of the interior as well as adding seat belts. Assembly of the engine included having to add spark plug wires and battery cables which would be toward the end of the build.

After about four hours in the dry booth the body came out to get the decal stripes added and back in the dry booth for a short time before adding the clear coats. After adding the clear coats, I was at a point that the body had to dry for a couple hours and I was as far along with assemble as I could be till the body was ready. So, I grabbed a short nap and waited for the body to dry. By mid-morning Sunday I had gotten down to a couple hours to go and assemble was going well until I had to attach a front and rear body piece. I had test fitted both before assembly and thought I had made the adjustments needed to fit properly, but as luck would have it they didn't. On a normal build I would spend the time to make adjustments and fit the correct way, but with time running out I just got the fit best I could and let it go. As I got into the last hour, I saw I was going to go over the 24 hour mark a little but hopefully not by much. In the end I finished about forty-five minutes over the mark and I will have to attach the battery cables at a later time.

As always this was a fun build even with the time restraint and lack of sleep for the most part. I look forward to doing this again next year and taking on all the unknowns it brings.
