Kit review: Hobby Boss A7 E 1/72

In general this is a good little kit and the build was fun. There was some of the usual fit problems. Every kit has a few. I was pleasantly surprised how well the fuselage halves snugged together, given the several interior pcs (cockpit tub, intake trunk, exhaust cone and electronic bays). After test fitting the wings to fuselage (a snug fit and minimal filling) I decided to treat wings And fuselage as 2 separate assemblies. I used Model Master acryl paints for upper and lower surfaces, the sidewinder missiles as the location holes for the launch rails didn't match up. Ample ordnance selection is provided The decals seated nicely with a bit of help using MicroSol. I sealed them with a brushed on coat of Pledge I am fairly pleased with my finished model, the frets were bagged as well as the clear parts, giving a good first impression upon first glance in the box. Adding to this is Good rivet detail and recessed panel lines. While the Corsair may not make the cut in a regional contest, it passes the 2 foot rule and so I'm happy. Wait.... What? It Bends?

With all the tools we have on our benches there is always room for that one more new thing to come along to make modeling a little easier. This new product I found out about was introduced to help the automotive modeler but like most items in our hobby there is use in all the different types of modeling for this new hobby knife blade.

This is a smaller blade than the normal Xacto but the unusual thing about this blade if how flexible it is. It will actually bend to a forty-five-degree angle which really helps in hard-to-reach places to scrape and remove seam lines, copyright marks on the bottom of car chassis and punch marks under fender wells as well as interior roofs. The blades are not as sharp as a regular blade but are sharp enough to do the simple jobs intended for it.

The blades do not come with a handle and the directions say that only certain Xacto handles work with it due to being really thin. I just put mine in one of my extra #1 handle's. The blades are available from the Fine Scale Modeler store and at flashmasterhobby.com
